1. OVERVIEW.

One of the services Woodgroup SA Inc offers its member clubs is to organize and coordinate events where statewide participation can be anticipated. Exhibitions featuring the diverse range of wood craft produced by affiliates of Woodgroup SA Inc are recognized as one of these services.

Exhibitions have traditionally been an important feature of the Woodgroup's calendar for many years. Woodgroup SA Inc is known in the recreational woodworking industry throughout Australia for its professional skills and expertise in presenting well organized and aesthetically appealing exhibitions.

Over past years the following successful exhibitions have been conducted by Woodgroup.

- As a major feature at the Adelaide Timber & Working With Wood Shows.
- At Urrbrae House in conjunction with the University of Adelaide.
- At the Adelaide Building and Home Improvements Show.
- At the Burnside Council Chambers in conjunction with the Burnside City Council.

These exhibitions have been well supported by the affiliates of Woodgroup SA Inc and have proved to be a successful outlet for the sales of quality woodcraft.

2. PURPOSE.

Woodgroup SA Inc empowers the Executive Committee to establish and direct a sub committee to organize and coordinate exhibitions with statewide participation and offer advice and support to member clubs that may wish to organize an exhibition in a regional area.

3. RELATIONSHIP.

The Exhibition Sub Committee is accountable to the Woodgroup S.A. Inc. Executive Committee and must therefore operate under the terms of the Woodgroup SA constitution, by laws and any policies, guidelines or procedures established by the Executive Committee. Within this framework the sub committee is encouraged to operate with a reasonable level of autonomy and independence.

4. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES.

- 4.1. To organize exhibitions that in all aspects embrace Woodgroup SA Inc's motto, "Promoting Fine Woodcraft", and
 - 4.1.1. are aesthetically appealing and effectively promote the skills and artistic qualities of the recreational woodworker, and
 - 4.1.2. reflect the quality of work, commitment and contribution that exhibitors make to their craft, and
 - 4.1.3. protect and enhance the good reputation and name of Woodgroup SA Inc.
- 4.2. The Board expects that all Exhibitions will be financially viable and operate at least on a cost neutral (break even) basis and wherever possible shall endeavor to return a profit.
- 4.3. All Woodgroup SA exhibitions are to provide opportunity for all member clubs to participate.
 - 4.3.1. They should provide opportunity for the inclusion of all woodwork crafts practiced within those clubs however this should not preclude an initiative to stage a craft specific exhibition.
- 4.4. The Executive Committee empowers the sub committee to raise sponsorship and enter into arrangements for each exhibition.
- 4.5. The sub committee will be permitted to communicate directly with member clubs in disseminating and collecting information related to staging an exhibition. Please refer to attached document entitled "*Policies and Guidelines for the Operation of Sub Committees*".

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
